Abstract

7) Independent

11) Responsibility

The sociology of literary works is concerned with a literary work that is the subject of study is about what is implied in the literary work and what the purpose and mandate to be conveyed. Third, the sociology of the reader. The sociology of readers deals with readers and their social influence on society.

D. Conclusion
